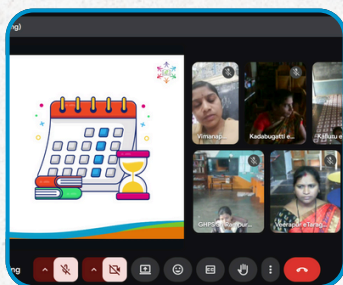
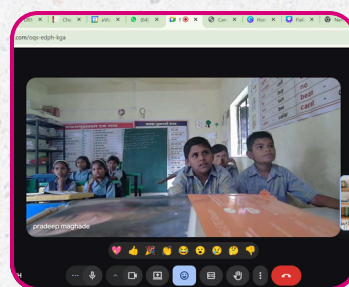
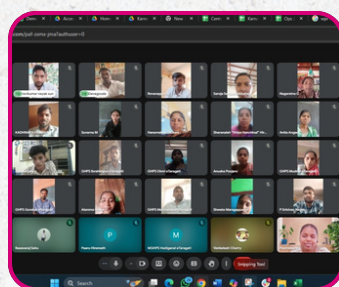
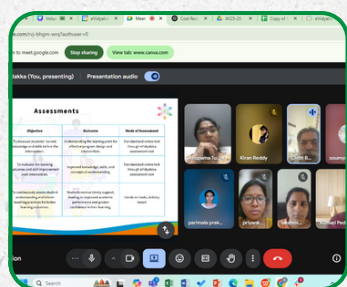


1,000+ Volunteers powering Digital Classrooms across 15 States

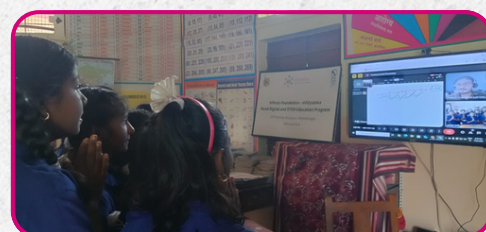

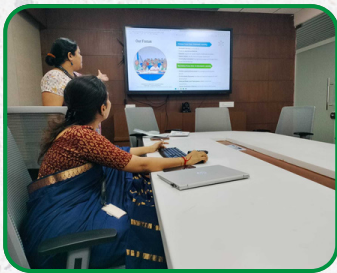




Strengthening the foothold: Training Class Assistants in Gujarat

A two-day training was conducted on **6th and 7th July 2025 in Morbi, Gujarat**, to equip 10 newly selected Class Assistants with the skills required to support Digital Classroom operations. Led by **Subha Kannan and Rinki Chowdhury**, the sessions focused on introducing eVidyaloka's online education model, outlining the responsibilities of Class Assistants, and hands-on learning in tracking classes, managing attendance, and reporting.

Interactive activities and live demonstrations ensured high engagement, and all participants were successfully onboarded and assigned to schools by the end of the training.



On 8th July, the team met with **Samagra Shiksha officials** in **Gandhinagar** to present the Digital Classroom model. The officials appreciated the initiative and expressed interest in drafting a central MoU for broader implementation across Gujarat.

AHT Team visits eVidyaloka Schools

The **AHT team** recently visited five schools to observe ongoing digital classes and engage with school stakeholders. During the visit to **ZPHS Kothapeta**, the team interacted with Volunteer Teacher Neeraja and the children and appreciated the enthusiastic participation of students in the live session.

A meaningful conversation with the Headmaster shed light on key local challenges, including early marriages, student dropouts due to distance, and the impact of community backgrounds on education.



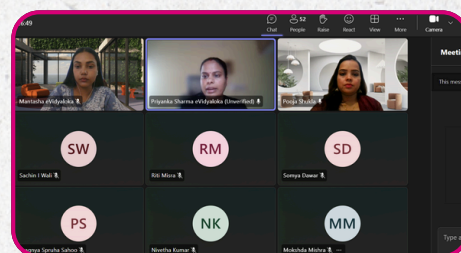

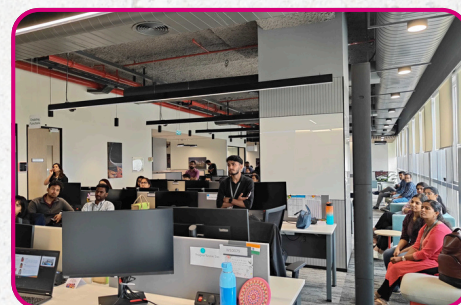
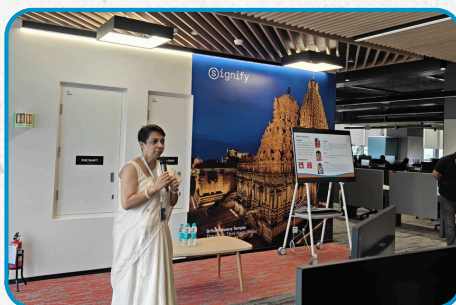
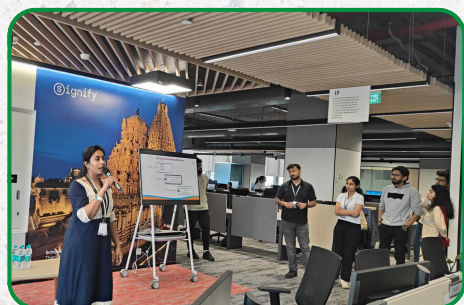
Corporate Volunteer Orientations drive Strong Engagement

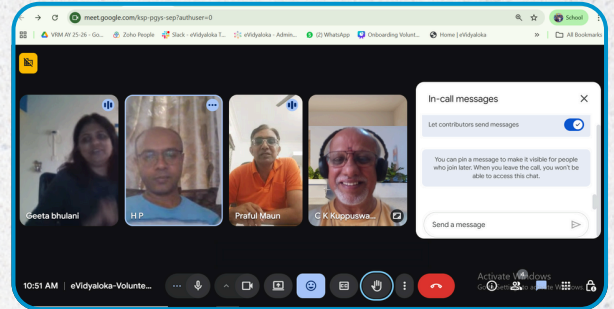

Building Digital Confidence Field Team Training in AHT Schools

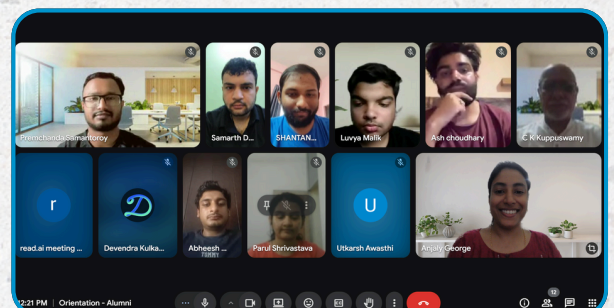

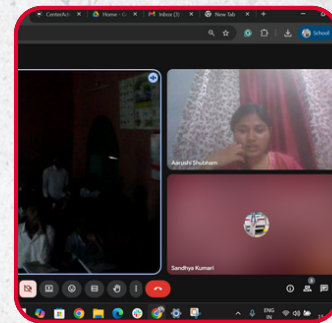
