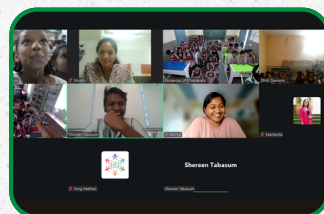
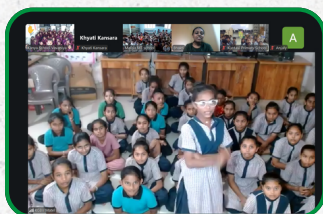
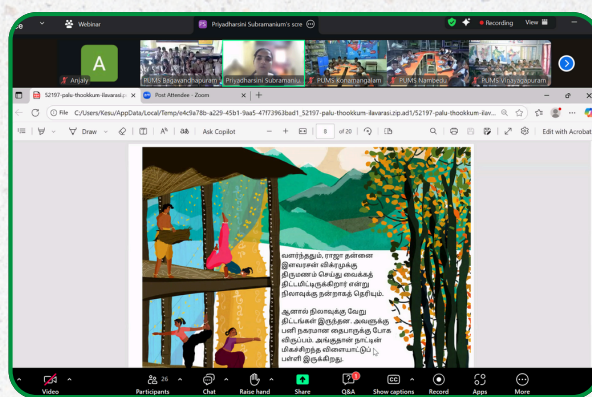
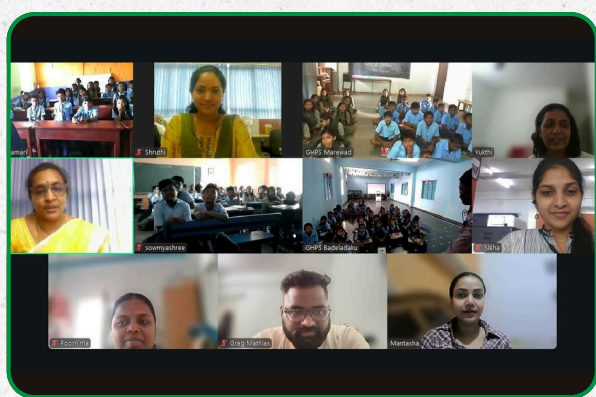


Talethon 2025 Celebrating Children's Day with Stories

National Education Day Celebration

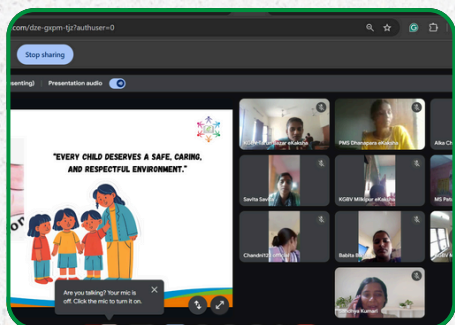
Observed on November 11th across 10 KGBVs in Assam, the day commemorated the birth anniversary of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad and reinforced the importance of education in shaping young futures. The celebration encouraged students to reflect on their aspirations, strengthen their writing and public-speaking skills, and deepen their understanding of the value of education.



A series of engaging activities marked the occasion, including Letter to Self where students penned their life goals, Essay Writing on the theme “Importance of Education,” Public speaking sessions, Collective book reading to nurture reading habits, and a student-led Skit highlighting why education matters.

Skill Development of Class assistants

A three-day capacity building training was conducted to empower class assistants across 15 states with essential digital, social-emotional, and safety-focused skills. The programme helped participants build self-awareness, set meaningful goals, and explore their strengths, skills, and passions in connection with real-life opportunities.



They also developed a foundational understanding of Social & Emotional Learning (SEL), learning to recognise emotions, practise empathy, manage stress, and apply SEL principles in their daily school environment. In addition, the training strengthened their awareness of child protection, safe school practices, menstrual hygiene support, and basic first aid. Through engaging activities and reflective exercises, class assistants left the workshop more confident, informed, and equipped to create safe, supportive, and inclusive learning spaces.

Infosys foundation leads Academic Progress Audit to strengthen Learning Outcomes

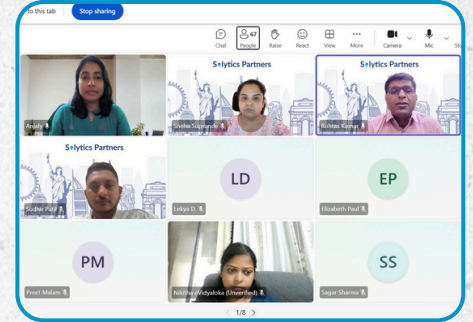

Strengthening partnerships, Expanding possibilities

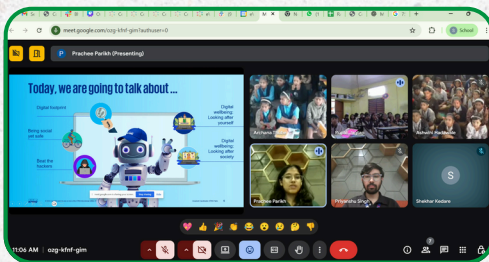
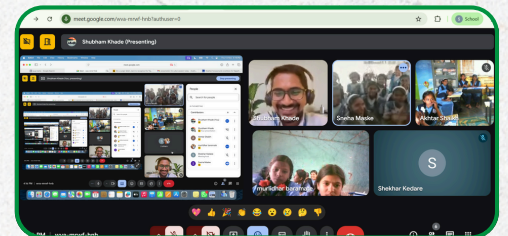

KPMG – Cyber Awareness Sessions

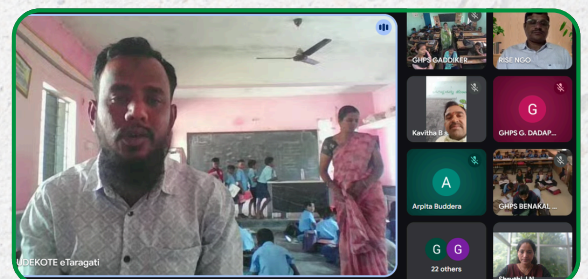

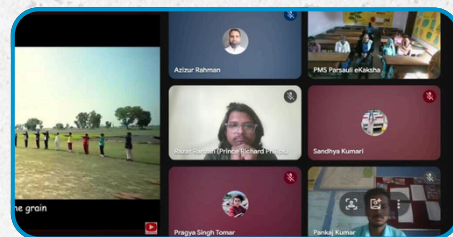




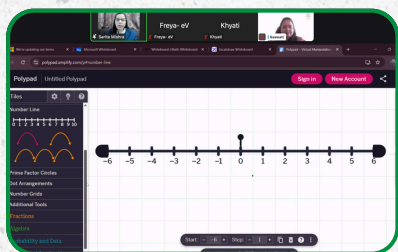
Many highlighted that the online sessions—especially English classes—are making a remarkable difference in their students’ learning experiences.

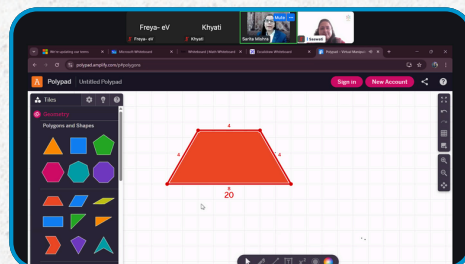


eleVate Webinar: Understanding and using Digital Math Tools

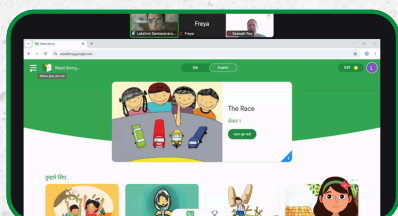

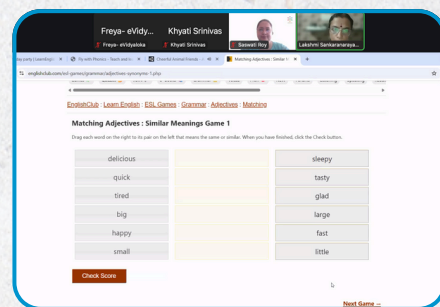
eleVate Webinar: The new era of gamified learning

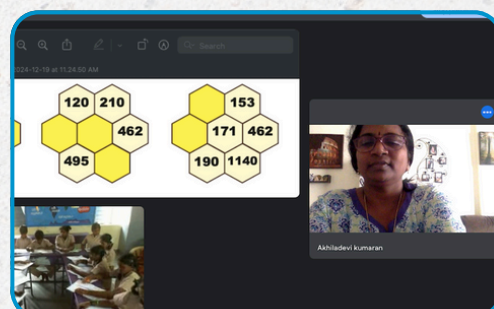


The Heart of Volunteering: Akhiladevi's classroom journey
