# Beginning of a Mission ...

The 2 year pilot was successful. 120 children were taught by 25 teachers across 5 centers in 3 states. Overcoming challenges in operations, teacher's learning curve, partner's unquestioned belief, and certain myths were broken,

- How can internet be stable and available in a rural village
- How can village people adopt such sophisticated technology and model
- How can a child connect emotionally with a virtual teacher
- How can a teacher control a class without able to have a physical access to the classroom

eVidyaloka model clearly came out to be a worthy proposition to be invested more for the following reasons:

- The children absolutely loved it
- A remote teacher developed a strong emotional connect with his/her children
- Not a single partner/school attrition, due to non-belief in the value of the model

The real mission of eVidyaloka began in April 2013, with the launch of scaling up and productionizing the model. Many questions and temptations were in front of us:

- Go to government now
- Get media coverage and make it popular

The think tank – the formal advisory board was expanded to add few more believers. Heads were put together and a Clear vision and Strategy was arrived at for the next 3 years, with a strong set of values.

Connecting passionate volunteers to provide Quality education for Rural Children

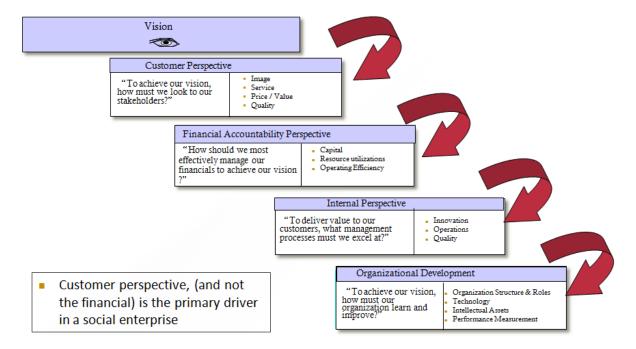

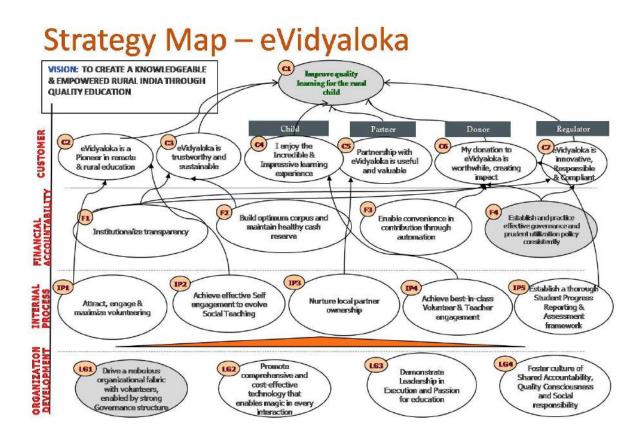
# The three year strategy plan

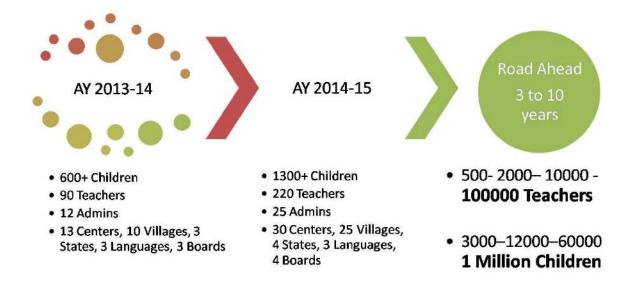


The below process was approached in laying out the various strategic objectives:

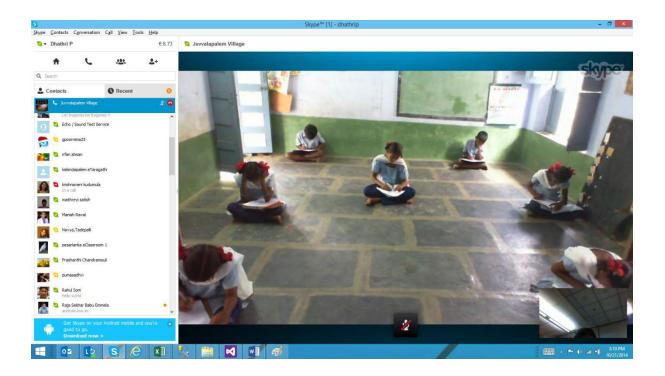

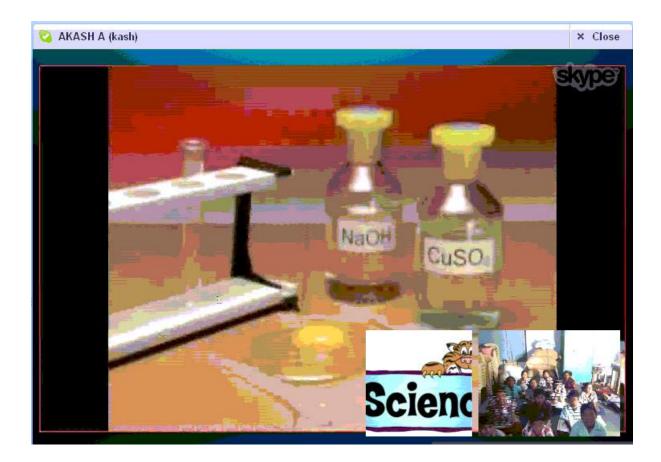
